Execute the emergency response plan

Performance criteria

You must be able to:

- P1 communicate your choice of pre-formed or newly constructed plan, either verbally, or with the use of the telephone system or personal radio to the appropriate people in a promptly and controlled manner and with authority and clarity
- P2 confirm the firefighting duties and tasks for search and rescue of personnel, team briefing and casualty handling with the appropriate people in accordance with the procedures
- P3 implement the plan and commenced the duties and tasks as agreed
- P4 monitor the progress of the plan by team and individual progress reports, visual observation and oral feedback. Take corrective actions including resource re-allocation and utilisation of people, materials and equipment and task prioritisation to actual or a potential deviation factors including resource consumption, stress levels and time
- P5 identify the secondary hazards and communicate incident information to the appropriate people by verbal means or use of the telephone or personal radio
- P6 interpret the information received from the appropriate people during the execution of the plan and use it to re-assess the situation in appreciation of changes to the problem, timescales and progress against targets
- P7 alter the pre-formed or newly constructed plans as required, to take account of changing circumstances associated with the weather conditions and problem escalation
- P8 adjust the objectives and priorities including response team protection, saving life, incident sectorisation, damage limitation passive fire protection, (as time permits) in consultation as appropriate, taking account of changing circumstances and information received from the appropriate people
- P9 confirm the remaining equipment and personnel required to contain the problem with the appropriate people
- P10 identify pre-formed plans and feasible alternatives and evaluate them as time allows
- P11 select and implement alternative options without delay
- P12 maintain communications with the appropriate people, verbally or by the use of the telephone or personal radio, throughout the incident as circumstances allow
- P13 de-brief the appropriate people on the incident in accordance with procedures
- P14 compile a summary of the incident in accordance with procedures and passed to the appropriate people.
- P15 initiate the servicing of equipment and restoration of stocks in accordance with procedures
