- P2 identify the pattern to be graded and confirm sizes required (master pattern)
- P3 check the master pattern for accuracy
- P4 select tools and equipment for grading patterns
- P5 identify the size standards and ensure they match the gender and age profile of the end customer
- P6 identify incremental grade rules that are appropriate for the country, market and customer
- P7 identify key body landmark measurements for specified product types
- P8 grade the master pattern applying incremental grade rules
- P9 create a 'nest' of graded sizes covering a range of larger and smaller sizes
- P10 trace graded patterns from the 'nest' and create finished patterns pieces in all relevant sizes
- P11 ensure patterns contain all relevant markings
- P12 label patterns with required information
- P13 store patterns following company procedures
- P14 complete appropriate records and documents
- P15 communicate effectively with colleagues and customers
- P16 identify problems and resolve issues within limits of your own responsibility
- P17 report problems outside area of responsibility to the appropriate person
- P18 work to legal requirements, standards and regulations, policies, procedures and professional codes

- K8 grading methods and techniques i.e. cut & spread, shifting
- K9 how to apply incremental grade rules
- K10 grading rules/scales/ grading conventions
- K11 how to create a 'nest' of patterns and trace off pattern pieces
- K12 critical body measurement points
- K13 how to interpret sizing surveys and information
- K14 the types, placement and meaning of pattern markings
- K15 labelling requirements i.e. size, number to cut, style number etc
- K16 quality standards and procedures
- K17 the limits of personal responsibility
- K18 how to report problems outside your area of responsibility
- K19 the importance of effective communication with customers and colleagues
- K20 the lines of communication, authority and reporting procedures
- K21 the organisation's procedures, rules, codes and guidelines
- K22 statutory responsibilities under health, safety and environmental legislation and regulations

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
