

Overview This standard is for those who lay up materials and cut different items that vary in style fabric and make up.

The job role may involve:

- 1 laying up materials and marking in the pattern pieces
- 2 identifying deviations and rectifying faults and flaws
- 3 cutting out pattern pieces from material



## Performance

- P2 select materials to match specifications/ customer requirements
- P3 mark in pattern shapes and pattern markings onto material
- P4 consider print placement and pattern repeat
- P5 match stripes/checks as appropriate
- P6 consider fabric stretch, shrinkage and relaxation
- P7 mark any additional allowances onto material accurately
- P8 identify and avoid fabric faults
- P9 identify deviations or issues with pattern pieces and markings
- P10 take corrective actions to remedy faults and flaws
- P11 lay up, mark in and cut materials within agreed time schedules
- P12 bundle and label cut components
- P13 forward or store cut items in the specified manner, to ensure that the quality is preserved
- P14 ensure quality standards are met throughout the process
- P15 complete appropriate records and documents
- P16 identify problems and resolve issues within limits of your own responsibility
- P17 report problems outside area of responsibility to the appropriate person
- P18 work to legal requirements, standards and regulations, policies, procedures and professional codes
