#### **Overview**

This standard covers the skills and knowledge needed to repair furniture faults, this includes upholstery, beds, mattresses, flat pack, mechanisms, fittings, leather and cabinet furniture. This is usually done in the customers home.

Damaged framework and slats, Rips, tears and scuffs, Soiling, Missing tufts and stitching, Drawer and drawer runner issues, Frame collapse, Protruding springs and rods, Under filling, Handset issues (electric beds), Synchronisation problems (electric beds), Pistons, support bars and mechanism problems (electric beds) and Mattress settlement

#### Flat Pack:

Cosmetic, Structural, Fixtures and fittings, Components

#### Mechanisms and Fittings:

Mechanisms, Fixtures, Lifting mechanisms, Recliners, Electrical components

#### Leather:

Scuffs, Scratches, Stains, Burn marks, Water marks, Discolouration, Tears
