

Overview

This standard is about providing specialist skin camouflage services to address a wide range of conditions, to restore the skin's colouring to match the unaffected skin tone. It also covers the use of a variety of specialist camouflage products, together with client instruction in the application, maintenance and removal of their own skin camouflage.

To carry out this standard you will need to maintain effective health, safety and hygiene throughout your work. You will also need to maintain your personal appearance and demonstrate effective communication and consultation skills.

The main outcomes of this standard are:

Performance criteria

You must be able to:

****Maintain safe and effective methods of working when providing specialist skin camouflage**

1. maintain your responsibilities for health and safety throughout the service
2. prepare your client and yourself to meet legal and organisational requirements
3. respect your client's modesty, privacy and any sensitivities to their personal appearance
4. position your client to meet the needs of the service without causing them discomfort
5. ensure your own posture and working methods minimise fatigue and the risk of injury to yourself and others
6. ensure environmental conditions are suitable for the client and the service
7. keep your work area clean and tidy throughout the service
8. use working methods that minimise the risk of cross-infection
9. ensure the use of clean equipment and materials
 1. promote environmental and sustainable working practices
 2. follow workplace and suppliers' or manufacturers' instructions for the safe use of equipment, materials and products
 3. dispose of waste materials to meet legal requirements
 4. complete the service within a commercially viable time

Consult, plan and prepare for specialist skin camouflage

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1.

use **consultation techniques** to determine the client's service plan

2.

ensure that informed and signed parent or guardian consent is obtained for minors prior to any service

3.

ensure that a parent or guardian is present throughout the service for minors under the age of 16

4.

recognise any contra-indications and take the **necessary action**

5.

identify and agree the skin **camouflageneeds** and the **areatobecamouflaged** with the client

6.

obtain signed, informed consent from the client prior to carrying out the service

7.

ensure the client understands the limitations of skin camouflage

Carry out specialist skin camouflage

1.

apply compatible skin care products and a complementary colour before the skin camouflage application

2.

use **application tools**, techniques and **camouflage products** which are best suited to the client and their skin **camouflage needs**

3.

establish an acceptable colour match on the **area to be camouflaged** to restore the skin colouration to the surrounding skin tone

4.

ensure **camouflage products** are applied to achieve the required density, colour and effect

5.

apply compatible cosmetic and skin care products after the skin camouflage application

6.
give your client **advice and recommendations** on the service provided
7.
ensure the client's records are completed and signed by you and the client

Instruct and advise the client on skin camouflage techniques

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1.
discuss and recommend **camouflage products** and application tools and techniques to meet the client's skin **camouflage needs**
2.
demonstrate application on the **areatobecamouflaged** and check the client's understanding
3.
use **instructional techniques** which are delivered at a pace suitable for the client
4.
guide the client through self-application and removal of the skin **camouflage product**
5.
guide the client on how to select and apply compatible cosmetic and skin care products, for use under or over their camouflage
6.
allow the client time to practise skin camouflage techniques on themselves
7.
provide the client with opportunities to give feedback, ask questions and seek clarification
8.
remind the client on the need to seek medical opinion if any lesions, moles, or conditions change
9.
remind the client that they should discontinue the use of **camouflage product** until medical opinion is sought

**Evaluate the success of instruction

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1.
ask your client to make an evaluation of their own learning and provide any additional instructions to meet their needs
2.
ask your client questions on the delivery of the instruction process and record their feedback
3.
use client feedback to make improvements to your own skin camouflage **instructional techniques** and delivery

Knowledge and understanding

You need to know and understand:

Maintain safe and effective methods of working when providing specialist skin camouflage

Glossary

Atrophic scar tissue

Scar tissue that is lower than the surrounding skin; an indented scar.

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Attributes of skin camouflage products

The positive effects of using camouflage products, such as being waterproof and providing a sunblock.

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Erythema

Redness to the skin caused by irritation, or injury to the tissue.

Fitzpatrick Classification System

Devised in 1975 at Harvard University, this is a skin classification system, measured on a scale of 1 to 6, based on photosensitivity reaction to ultra violet radiation.

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Hypertrophic scar tissue

Scar tissue that is higher than the surrounding skin; a protruding scar.

Hyperpigmentation

Excessive colouration in comparison to the surrounding skin due to excess melanin (for example age spots, freckles, stretch marks, sun tan, melasma and chloasma).

Hypopigmentation

Loss of colouration in comparison to the surrounding skin area (for example leucoderma, stretch marks, scarring, vitiligo).

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
